# **Clinical Services**

ROOTS AND RENEWAL CLINICAL SERVICES

In 2016, the Center served 3,700 individuals – 75 percent through comprehensive clinical services that address a broad range of mental health issues. Several highlights include:

# **COUNSELING FOR ADULTS**

In 2016, Center counselors helped more than 2,100 adults address a variety of issues including depression, anxiety, substance abuse, trauma, anger, relationships, divorce, grief and loss, blended families, eating disorders, self-harm, social phobia, caregiver stress, sexual and gender identity, post-traumatic stress, career transitions and other life issues.

# SPANISH SPEAKING COUNSELING SERVICES

The Center introduced Spanish speaking counseling services in 2016 utilizing the language skills of a student in the Center's graduate student clinical practicum program, Alicia Krpan. A native Spanish speaker, Alicia was hired as a full time counselor at the Center following the successful completion of her nine month practicum. Alicia will help the Center expand counseling services to the Spanish speaking community in Greater Des Moines.

# COUNSELING FOR CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS—C.O.O.L

For more than 20 years the
Center has offered a specialized
counseling approach for children
and adolescents, C.O.O.L. (Children
Overcoming the Obstacles of Life).
In 2016, the Center's C.O.O.L. practice
served 645 young people plus
their families through experiential
therapeutic methods integrating art,
play and physical movement into
the counseling process.



The paint wall is a signature aspect to the Center's C.O.O.L. practice, offering a safe space for young people to express their inner life with their C.O.O.L. counselors through color, texture and physical movement.

# **PSYCHIATRY**

The Center provided more than 3,400 sessions of psychiatry services to children, adolescents and adults in 2016 through our team of medication providers, Geoffrey Hills, D.O., psychiatrist and Susan Koehler, P.A.-C., psychiatry physician assistant.

# GRADUATE STUDENT CLINICAL PRACTICUM

In 2016, the Center welcomed five graduate psychology students into a rigorous and intensive psychotherapy training experience, in partnership with Drake University, Iowa State, the University of Iowa and other graduate counseling programs. The Center has trained more than 110 graduate students over the years, bolstering the next generation of mental health clinicians in Iowa and across the nation.

Each graduate practicum student is matched with an experienced counselor at the Center who serves as their mentor for the duration of the experience (usually nine months). Pictured are three of the Center's 2016 students and their respective mentors: Laura Nydam, L.I.S.W. (mentor); Amy Spangler-Dunning, M.Div., L.M.H.C. 


# A CULTURE OF KNOWLEDGE

The Center's mission of counseling and education doesn't stop with clients, students and community. Continuous learning is also encouraged among staff. Clinicians meet weekly to discuss best practices and learn new skills. In 2016, our clinicians taught and participated in many workshops including Memory Loss and Cognitive Decline, Affirmative LGBTQ Counseling, Trauma and the Body, Mindfulness Techniques and Current Issues in Street Narcotics with a guest presenter from the Des Moines Police Department.







# **PSYCHOLOGICAL TESTING**

In 2016 the Center provided 344 hours of psychological testing and assessment. The Center's testing team of licensed psychologists offer a variety of assessments including: intelligence assessment (IQ), learning disorder testing, adaptive behavior, assessment of developmental challenges, Autism Spectrum assessment, testing for Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), emotional functioning/personality assessment, memory testing, testing for differential diagnosis for clients of all ages, and more.

One testing method utilized by the Center is the Rorschach Performance Assessment System (R-PAS). Center psychologist, Eva Christiansen, Ph.D. is a Rorschach expert and her father is internationally known in the same field. The Rorschach is a psychological test in which a client's perceptions of inkblots are recorded and analyzed. Eva explains: "The process involves a lot of interaction between the clinician and client." Additionally, Eva provides clinical and forensic assessments, plus assessments for disability applicants, worker's compensation and law enforcement officers.





# Leadership and Spiritual Life

The Center's Leadership and Spiritual Life programs engaged 950 individuals in 2016. The programs provided resources for individuals, faith communities, clergy and religious judicatories (administrators) to deepen spiritual life, and serve in various forms of ministry both within and outside of institutional structures.

A partial listing of 2016 program highlights include:

- 40 students participated in PrairieFire spiritual formation program
- 491 sessions of spiritual direction
- 76 clergy participated in ethical boundary training workshops
- 64 individuals participated in PrairieFire, 40 completed the two-year program and 24 new students began their program
- 63 individuals participated in suicide prevention and intervention trainings
- 52 clergy candidates received psychological assessments
- 27 individuals participated in the Pastoral Care Specialist program, training on topics critical to effective pastoral care.
- 15 clergy completed Intentional Interim Ministry training
- 8 congregational assessments were utilizing the Church Assessment Tool (CAT) in collaboration with Holy Cow Consulting.

# PROGRAM FOCUS: Redefining Aging

Aging is better than the alternative, according to the Center's Redefining Aging program facilitators. In 2016, 50 community members launched the program with a four-part conversation series on holistic and lively aging. Those conversations formed the basis for additional programs including:

- Wisdom Stories a writing class for elders in training
- A Spirituality of Being Mortal

# PROGRAM FOCUS: PrairieFire

One of the most enduring programs at the Center is the PrairieFire spiritual renewal program.

In 2016 40 individuals participated in this two-year process to a deeper spiritual life. The experience is based on a curriculum integrating understandings from contemporary spiritual thought and psychological theory with the rich theological wisdom of the early Christian contemplative tradition. An optional third year is available to those who complete the PriaireFire experience and choose to pursue a certificate in spiritual direction.

# Thank you to Ellery Duke

Ellery H. Duke, Ph.D. — counselor, pastor, mentor, leader, father, husband and bicycle aficionado — retired from the Center in 2016 after 40 of service as licensed psychologist and executive director. Under Ellery's guidance, the Center grew from a small counseling group to a multi-faceted nonprofit organization that annually serves thousands of individuals through 26 clinicians. To honor Ellery, the community raised more than \$50,000 for the Ellery H. Duke Fund for Hope & Healing, supporting new and innovative counseling programs and services, and sustaining the mission.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the Ellery H. Duke Fund for Hope & Healing. And thank you to Ellery, for quietly cultivating the Center's deep roots, nurturing and growing the mission of counseling and education for almost a half century.

Featured here are a select few of the multitude of accomplishments the Center made with Ellery at the helm. In 2007, under his leadership, the Center celebrated 35 years of service in the community and launched the Campaign for Hope and Healing to create a new facility. The campaign raised \$2.8 million and in June of 2010 ground was broken for the new facility where we operate today.





In 2012 Ellery biked across the U.S. -3,571 miles in 32 days - to raise awareness and more than \$30,000 for mental health services.





# A Walk Across Iowa for Men and Boys




ROOTS AND RENEWAL COMMUNITY SUPPORT


